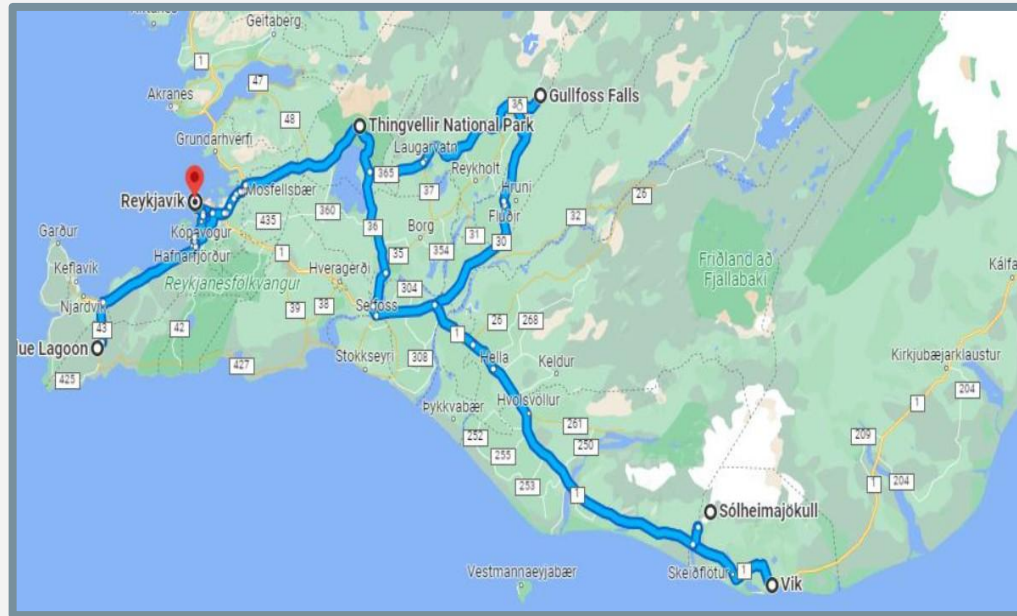

Renewable Energy

- Iceland starting switching to renewable energy in the 1960s.
- Almost all electricity in Iceland is produced using renewable energy resources. Electricity is provided by hydropower plants (73%) and geothermal energy (26.8%).
- Almost 99% of electricity is produced using renewable resources!!

MEALS

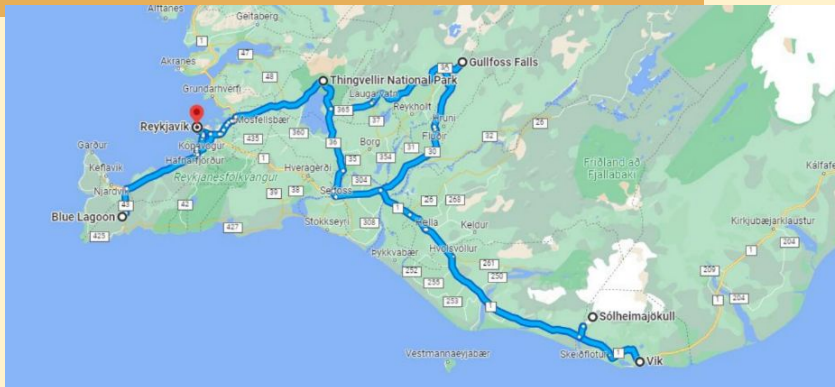
Breakfasts (B) – daily at the hotels, except day of arrival – buffet at hotels including coffee/tea/juice (6)
