



School






Historical Students/ Staff Ratio



The Mental Health Plan

The goal is complete mental health, focussing on fostering well-being skills and strengths as well as addressing mental health issues.

- Flexible and creative solutions
- Tiered approach to assessment
- Ongoing and fluid assessments, screenings, and referrals
- Parent and staff mental health is essential for both staff and student well-being



Hybrid Plan Implementation 2020-21

- All 3 Plan types are works in progress with continual adjustments and improvements.
- Hybrid plans are predicated on masks and social-distancing.
- We have a shared goal of incremental, in-person learning as health metrics allow.
- We anticipate moving in and out of plan types, based on changing health conditions (yellow, orange, and red zones).
- Cohort students at all three levels for contact tracing and quarantining purposes.
- Teaching and learning in different modalities: in-person, remote, virtual-only, and live-streaming as appropriate.



Short-, Mid-, and Long- Term Planning

- Short Term (Fall):
 - Restart Committee and communications
 - Plan assessment short-term and ongoing
 - Logistical and instructional adjustments and improvements
- Mid-Term/Long-Term (winter, spring):
 - COVID-19 testing program (limited site lab vs. independent vendor)
 - o Yellow, Orange, and Red zone designations
 - Budgeting, staffing, and logistical issues both for this year and next
 - Addressing on-going space constraints


Board of Education: Goal and Priorities
